<b>Mental Health</b>	
Walk -in Mental Health Counselling	One-time counselling sessions
Mental Health Counselling Sessions	6-12 sessions of 1-1, couple or family counselling
Mental Health Group Work	Multi session workshops focused on inner healing.
<b>Housing</b>	
Housing Support Services	Housing stabilization and support for those who are homeless, precariously housed or at risk of eviction.
Genesis Place	Three year transitional housing.
<b>Food Services</b>	
Food Bank	Bi-monthly grocery distribution to people within certain catchment area.
Nutritional Classes	Educational courses.
<b>Mentoring</b>	
Individual 1:1	Volunteer based program that provides 1 to 1 mentorship for up to one year.
Family to Family	Volunteer based program that provides mentorship to families by families, for up to one year.
<b>Double Take Thrift Store</b>	
Discount clothing store	Discounted quality clothing providing professional and casual clothing for the community.
Workforce Development	Supportive work placement as part of YSM's workforce development programming.
<b>Employment Services</b>	
Employment Services	Job search and employment preparation support. This may include one-on-one conversations, resume workshops, life-skill training and interview preparation.
Employer Services	The cultivation and creation of supportive work placements by job developers. Job fairs.
Next Steps	Job search and employment preparation support for youth.
YJC (Youth Job Connect) & YJCS (Summer)	The Youth Job Connection program serves youth aged 15 to 29 who experience multiple and/or complex barriers to employment by providing intensive supports beyond traditional job search and placement opportunities.
RAMP	Job retention support for youth.
Opportunities Fund (OF)	Job preparation, placement and retention support for people self-disclosing with mental health disability.
Workforce Development	Two tier approach to employment services focusing equally on both the individual job seeker and the employer.
<b>Bridges Program (Adults Experiencing Chronic Poverty)</b>	
Take Away Meals	Twice weekly hot prepared meals for 100 people.
Relief Services	Access to personal support items such as clothing, toiletries, tokens etc.
Courses & Support Groups	Various group based learning and support gatherings focused on life skills, habits of daily living, recovery and pre-employment preparation.
Vet Clinic	Quarterly prevention services for local residents with cats and dogs.
Care Management	Intensive one-on-one support for adults looking to reach goals.
Church at the Mission	Emotional and Spiritual Support for residents including weekly worship gatherings, small group study sessions and one-on-one pastoral care.
<b>Cornerstone Family Services</b>	
Daycare	Licensed care with subsidies available through the City of Toronto Children's Services. infant care 3 months – 18months; Toddler Care 18months- 2.5 years; Preschool 2.5 years – Kindergarten 3.8 years.
Computer Lab	Children & adult courses focused on technical skills.
Camps	Spring and Summer Camps for youth living in Regent Park.
Care Management	support for families in crisis who have CAS involvement. We connect you to the services and resources that you need to help navigate court matters and CAS requirements.
Courses&Support Groups	Various ongoing courses for employment preparation as well as emotional support for men, women and families.
Scholarships	Financial Supports to youth for post-secondary education.
<b>YSM Evergreen Services for Street-Involved Youth</b>	
Meals	Hot meals services five days a week.
Drop In	A low barrier safe place for youth to be, five days a week. Includes personal supports such as showers, clothing and toiletries.
HOPE Care Management	Intensive one-on-one support for youth on probation including accompaniments, special events, employment preparation and family reconciliation. Some financial supports included such as commissary and/or fine repayment.
Jubilee	An arts focused entrepreneurial program.
Nursery - Care Management	Intensive one to one support for young parents including drop-in quality childcare, personal support like diapers and clothing.

Foot Clinic	Foot care, including free shoes and access to chiropodist.
Nurse Practitioner/Nurse/Pre-Natal Nurse	General health care support provided by YSM staff.
Dental	Delivered by qualified professional Dental Professionals: Dentists, Hygienists, Surgeons, offering x-rays, extractions, orthodontics, etc.
Psychiatrist	Delivered by qualified professional volunteers.
Physician	Delivered by qualified professional volunteers.
